Ali Kazma (1971, Istanbul) completed his BA at the University of Colorado Boulder and received his MA from The New School University in New York City. The artist, who represented Turkey at the 55th Venice Biennale in 2013, had a comprehensive solo show at Jeu de Paume, Paris in 2017. Ali Kazma's solo shows took place in museums and galleries including Galeri Nev İstanbul, Analix Forever (Geneva), Albergo Diurno Venezia (Milan), MUNTREF (Buenos Aires), ARTER (Istanbul), CAPRI (Düsseldorf), Hirshhorn Museum (Washington). Group shows and biennials include the 6th Kuandu Biennale (Taipei), 7th Moscow International Biennale of Contemporary Art, MAXXI (Rome), Musée d'Art Contemporaine de Lyon, 30th Sao Paulo Biennial, Istanbul Biennial, Istanbul Modern and New Museum (New York). He received the UNESCO Prize for Promotion in the Arts in 2001 and the Nam June Paik Award in 2010. The artist's works are included in a large number of international collections.

also had a comprehensive solo show at the Galata Greek School in 2017. In 2018, Ipek was invited to the residency program, Cité des Arts in Paris, where he spent 6 months working. Ipek's artist book, consisting of 89 works each representing one day from the "Days" series was published in 2018 with the support of SAHA Association. Ahmet Doğu İpek (1983, Adıyaman). The artist, who had his solo exhibition at Galeri Nev Istanbul in 2019,

Canan Tolon (1955, Istanbul) studied interior architecture in Edinburgh and Germany. She completed her masters in architecture at the University of California, Berkeley (UCB) in 1983. Tolon's monographic survey exhibition documenting her production since 1989 took place at Istanbul Modern in 2019. Her extensive solo show was held at Parasol-unit, London in 2014. Tolon's other solo shows include art spaces including Galeri Nev Istanbul, Gallery Paule Anglim (California), San Francisco Modern Museum of Art (California), Borusan Art Gallery (Istanbul), group shows include Lesher Center for the Arts (California), Pera Museum (Istanbul), British Museum (London), Kiev Biennial, National Museum of Women in the Arts (Washington). Her awards include the Emeryville Public Arts Award and San Francisco Focus Design Awards.

Füsun Onur (1938, Istanbul). After graduating from Uskudar American Academy for Girls in 1956, Füsun

Onur started studying Sculpture in the Academy of Fine Arts and became a student at Hadi Bara Atelier. Onur continued her education at the Maryland College of Art with a Fulbright scholarship in 1960 and graduated from the department of Sculpture. The artist held her first solo exhibition at Taksim Art Gallery in 1970, followed by her exhibitions in a number of art spaces including Academy of Fine Arts, the 1st, 4th, 12th and 14th Istanbul Biennials, Atatürk Cultural Center (AKM), Istanbul Painting and Sculpture Museum, Maçka Art Gallery (Istanbul), Staatliche Kunsthalle (Baden Baden), Brussels Botanical Gardens (Belgium), Lund Konsthall (Sweden). Onur was invited to dOCUMENTA in 2012. Her extensive solo show curated by Emre Baykal, "Through the Looking Glass" took place at Arter in 2014. The artist has participated in numerous international exhibitions internationally including art spaces in Sweden, Macedonia, Netherlands, France, Germany. Her works are included in international museum collections.

Cevdet Erek (1974, Istanbul) studied Architecture at Mimar Sinan Fine Arts University. He worked in

various architectural offices after his graduation and started working with the music band Nekropsi. After studying Sound Engineering and Design at Dr. Erol Üçer Center for Advanced Studies in Music (MIAM), ITU, he went to Rijksakademie, Amsterdam as a guest artist. His installations and performances took place in institutions and international exhibitions such as dOCUMENTA (Kassel), Istanbul Biennial, Sydney Biennale, Sharjah Biennale, Stedelijk Museum (Amsterdam), MAXXI (Rome), Tate Modern (London), Istanbul Modern, ARTER (Istanbul), SALT (Istanbul). The artist whose solo shows include M HKA (Antwerp), MUAC (Mexico), Kunsthalle Basel, MaerzMusik (Berlin), Spike Island (Bristol), Künstlerhaus Stuttgart, Hamburger Bahnhof (Berlin) and ARTER (Istanbul), represented Turkey at the Venice Biennial in 2017 with his solo show. He received the Nam June Paik Media Prize in 2012. Erek also gives lectures on Music Technologies at ITU MIAM where he works as an Associate Professor.

Francisco MoMA, Hayward Gallery (London) Museum Mönchehaus (Goslar), Kestner Gessellschaft (Hannover), Lentos Kunstmuseum Linz (Austria), ARTER, Tanas (Berlin), group shows and biennials include institutions such as Martin-Gropius-Bau (Berlin), Schirn Kunsthalle (Frankfurt), High Line (New York), Kemper Museum of Contemporary art (Kansas City, Missouri), Open Spaces 2018 (Kansas City, Missouri), dOCUMENTA (Kassel & Athens), 57th Venice Biennale, 11th Sharjah Biennial, 11th Istanbul Biennial, 8th Taipei Biennial and XIV Biennale Internazionale di Scultura di Carrara. The artist lives and works in Berlin.

Cennetoğlu is currently an advisor at the Rijksakademie, Amsterdam.


